The United States is the second largest consumer of energy in the world, and Texas accounts for about one-seventh of the nation's total energy consumption according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration. For years, studies have found that building energy codes are the easiest and most cost-effective way to maximize energy efficiency, as well as reduce overall energy consumption in communities.¹
